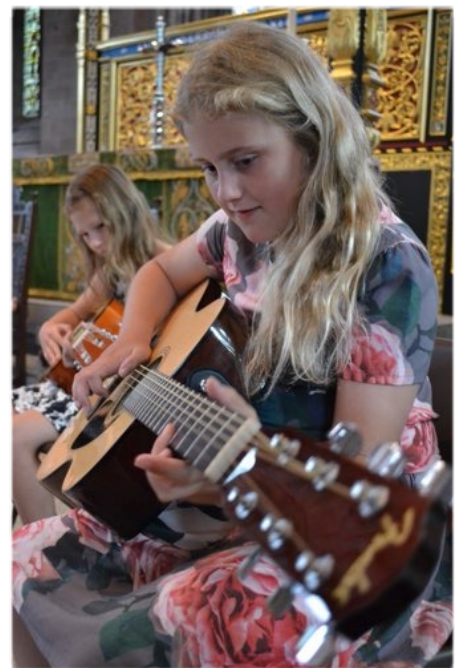
Meanwhile, Years 4 and 5 were studying the Ancient Greeks and Egyptians respectively, and
