We are Always Learning

Summer Challenges

To help the children keep the momentum going in their learning, we recommend you keep up the reading practice and play maths games, or do some summer maths practice during the summer.

School Year just ended	Suggestions for practice
Reception	Adding 1 to numbers (counting on) Taking away 1 from numbers (counting back) Counting forwards and backwards
Year 1	Numbers which go together to make 5: 1+4, 2+3, 3+2, 4+1, 5+0 Numbers which go together to make 10: 10+0, 9+1, 8+2, 7+3, 6+4, 5+5, etc. Adding numbers less than 10: e.g. 6 is 5 and 1 more.
Year 2	Numbers which go together to make 20 Counting in 2s Counting in 10s 2x 5x and 10x tables Doubling and halving numbers
Year 3	2x 5x 10x 3x and 4x tables
Year 4	2x 5x 10x 3x 4x 6x 8x tables
Year 5	2x 5x 10x 3x 4x 6x 8x 7x 9x tables


