### Hall and Kitchen Extension in the Pipeline for 2016

We are delighted that Cumbria County Council have given the green light for Robert Ferguson Primary School to have an extension to the downstairs hall, and the creation of a new kitchen. Our pupil school council have been instrumental in making this happen, writing letters to gain the support of Denton Holme councillor, Hugh McDevitt.

The improved facilities will mean that pupils have improved dining facilities, kitchen staff have a safer working environment, and whole school assemblies remain possible as the school continues to grow towards full subscription following our intake being increased from 45 to 60 per year group from September 2013. Our Nursery, Reception and Year 1 are already fully subscribed, with waiting lists.

Plans will be on display in school after the Easter break. Subject to planning permission, it is hoped that work will commence on the extension in June with completion by October.


